



The Books




First published in 1970, nine years after Hemingway's death, *Islands in the Stream* is a work of fiction—the story of an artist and adventurer, a man much like Hemingway himself.

Beginning in the 1930s, *Islands in the Stream* follows the fortunes of Thomas Hudson, from his experiences as a painter on the Gulf Stream island of Bimini through his antisubmarine activities off


the coast of Cuba during World War II. Hemingway is at his mature best in this beguiling tale.






Tim O'Brien's celebrated classic *In the Lake of the Woods* is a riveting novel of love and mystery from the author of *The Things They Carried*. Drawing in part on his own experiences in war, O'Brien examines the lasting impact of the twentieth century's legacy of violence and warfare, both at home and abroad. When long-hidden secrets about the atrocities he committed in Vietnam come to light, a

candidate for the U.S. Senate retreats with his wife to a lakeside cabin in northern Minnesota. Within days of their arrival, his wife mysteriously vanishes into the watery wilderness.



I, Tituba: Black Witch of Salem is a wild and entertaining novel which expands on the true story of the West Indian slave Tituba, who was accused of witch-craft in Salem, Massachusetts, arrested in 1692, and forgotten in jail until the general amnesty for witches two years later. Maryse Condé brings Tituba out of historical silence and creates for her a fictional childhood, adolescence, and old age. She

turns Tituba into what she calls "a sort of female hero, an epic heroine, like the legendary 'Nanny of the maroons," who, schooled in the sorcery and magical ritual of *obeah*, is arrested for healing members of the family that owns her.
