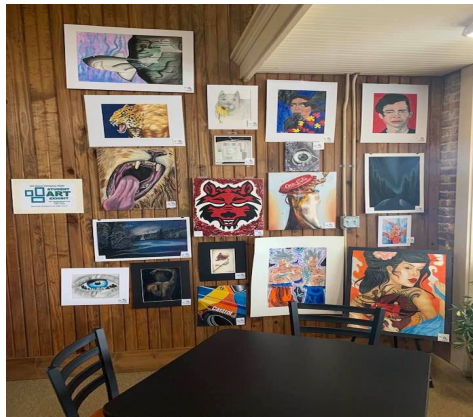




## Annual Student Art Exhibit
