
Retreat Description

On July 8, 1918, Ernest Hemingway was wounded near Venice, Italy, while serving as an ambulance driver in World War I. During the late 1940s, he fell in love with the city he had defended in his youth—and with young Venetian Adriana Ivancich. In this retreat, we'll use books, film, a new photo exhibit and a Venetian-themed mystery party to explore the city that enchanted Hemingway.


The Books



The story of Richard Cantwell, a war-ravaged American colonel stationed in Italy at the close of the Second World War, and his love for a young Italian countess. A bittersweet homage to love that overpowers reason, to the resilience of the human spirit, and to the worldweary beauty and majesty of Venice. Across the River and into the Trees stands as Hemingway's statement of defiance in response to


the great dehumanizing atrocities of the Second World War.






The City of Falling Angels is John Berendt's first book since Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil, and it immediately reminds one what all the fuss was about. Turning to the magic, mystery, and decadence of Venice, Berendt gradually reveals the truth behind a sensational fire that in 1996 destroyed the historic Fenice opera house. Encountering a rich cast of characters, Berendt tells a tale full of atmosphere and

surprise as the stories build, one after the other, ultimately coming together to portray a world as finely drawn as a still-life painting.



In the fall of 1948, Ernest Hemingway and his fourth wife traveled for the first time to Venice, which Hemingway. A year shy of his fiftieth birthday, Hemingway hadn't published a novel in nearly a decade when he met and fell in love with Adriana Ivancich, a striking Venetian girl just out of finishing school. Here Andrea di Robilant re-creates with sparkling clarity this surprising, years-long

relationship, during which Adriana inspired a man thirty years her senior to complete his great final work.
